




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Poster of Campus Environmental Initiative Waste Bin Donation



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




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Poster Of Caring For The Street- Dwelling Public: Lunch Packet Distribution In Palarivattom And Edappally.

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

In addition to fostering creativity, the workshop aimed to develop fine motor skills of MANAGEMEN and an understanding of sequential art. The day concluded with a showcase where


