

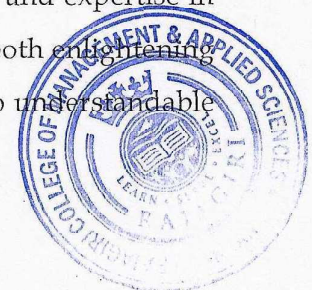
Report: Seminar on Intellectual Property Rights & Trademarks
