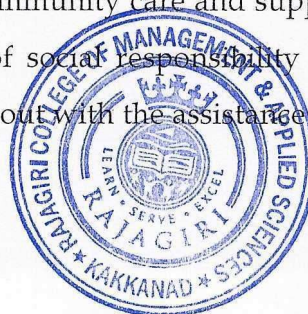

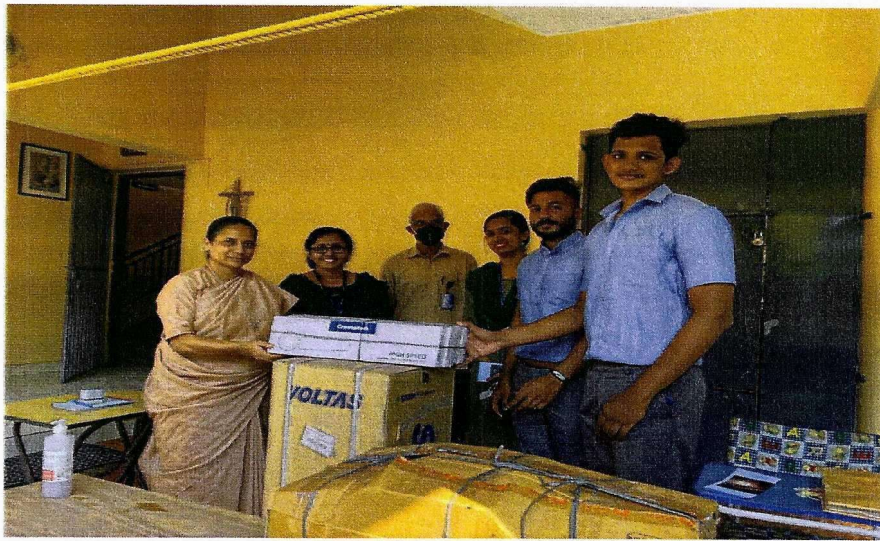



During this impactful visit, Rajagiri's team didn't just engage in dialogue and

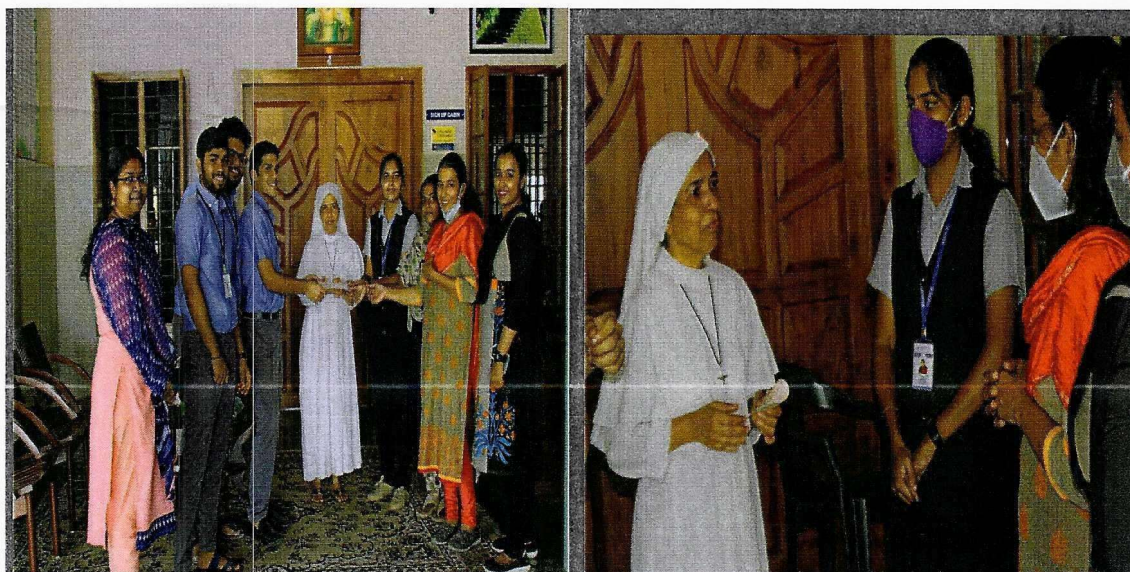






**Poster of Cultural Sharing: Onasadhya Festivity at Capernaum Trust**




