Since its inception, RCMAS has been dedicated to upholding ethical values intrinsic to Indian culture. Through its student centered activities, the institution imparts teachings that emphasize integrity, respect, and harmony, drawing from traditional Indian philosophies. The college is dedicated to preserving and promoting India's rich cultural and intellectual heritage through a variety of initiatives and activities on its campus. The curriculum includes the teaching and learning of both the Indian national language and regional languages. English classes incorporate literature that relates to Indian culture, identity and tradition.

The establishment of a dedicated Yoga library in campus, which serves as a comprehensive resource hub on Yoga philosophy, asanas (postures), and practices. This initiative aims to deepen students' and faculty members' understanding and appreciation of this ancient Indian discipline, encouraging its integration into their daily lives. Additionally, the college promotes wellness through a one-year diploma course in Ayurveda Panchakarma Therapy & Nursing, RCMAS also conducts regular workshops and seminars on Yoga and Ayurveda to further enrich the college community's knowledge and engagement with these holistic health traditions.

RCMAS enriches its cultural fabric by showcasing the diverse tapestry of Indian folklore through traditional art forms at key events. During the spirited Onam harvest festival, the campus resonates with the graceful Thiruvathira, performed by women. The festivities also feature the majestic Kathakali, renowned for its dramatic narratives and intricate attire. On other major events also, the students perform folklore related cultural programmes. The Sakshari Club (Literary & Literacy Club) organizes competitions for students in Hindi & Malayalam. These competitions encourage active engagement with the languages, motivating students to delve deeper into their grammar, vocabulary, and literary traditions. By participating in debates, essay writing, or poetry recitation focused on Indian themes, students not only hone their language skills but also gain a richer understanding of the cultural heritage and knowledge embedded within these languages. The Dancs Club Natya & Music Club Ragalaya regularly organize workshops on traditional dance styles and instruments regularly.

Nakshatravanam (star forest or celestial garden) is nurtured in the College campus which is a concept in Indian astrology and horticulture. It involves planting specific trees or plants that correspond to the 27 nakshatras (lunar mansions) recognized in Hindu astrology. This concept combines traditional Indian knowledge systems, Astrology and Botany.

Festivals of both national and regional importance are celebrated on campus. The Wings of Wisdom Club focuses on observing days of national or international significance through social media, posters, and campus announcements, encouraging student and staff involvement.

Study tours and industrial visits provide students with opportunities to collect first-hand information on Indian history, art, and culture. Through these initiatives, RCMAS fosters a profound connection to India's cultural and intellectual heritage among its students. For example, our students visit coir factory at Alappuzha, Kerala and gain insights into the traditional craft of coir production, learning about the processes involved in creating various eco-friendly products like mats, rugs, and ropes. They also observe sustainable practices, understand the socio-economic importance of the coir industry in local communities. When students visit Edakkal Caves in Wayanad, they gain knowledge about ancient history and archaeology, exploring prehistoric rock carvings that date back to the Neolithic and early historic periods.

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Training in traditional screw pine weaving was given to the students of BA Animation and Graphic Design at Kudumbasree Community, Kottapuram Integrated Development Society (KIDS), Ernakulam

Sessions on Vedic Mathematics were provided to students by Mr W T Paul, Associate Professor at RCMAS. Vedic mathematics is an ancient Indian system of mental calculation techniques based on principles derived from the Vedas, particularly the Atharva Veda.

Through these initiatives, RCMAS demonstrates a steadfast commitment to preserving and promoting India's rich knowledge system. By providing a platform for learning, celebrating, and practicing these traditions, the college empowers students to connect with their heritage and contribute to its flourishing future.









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Promotion of Ayurveda

RCMAS organizes various activities to familiarize students with the traditional knowledges of India. The college offers a one-year diploma course in Ayurveda Panchakarma Therapy & Nursing through Patanjali Pranayoga Vidyapeedom. This course is recognized by the STED Council (Scientific & Technical Education Development Council which is an approved partner of the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). This program equips students with valuable skills in this time-honoured Indian medical system.

Through this comprehensive program, students gain hands-on experience in:

- Panchakarma: The five Ayurvedic cleansing therapies designed to eliminate toxins and restore balance.
- **Herbal Medicine:** Understanding the properties and applications of various herbs used in Ayurvedic treatments.
- Therapeutic Techniques: Learning massage techniques like Abhyanga and Shirodhara, which are core components of Ayurvedic therapies.






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Program Poster of Prana



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Biodiversity Register of RCMAS

Our campus boasts a rich diversity of flora with over 284 identified varieties including plants and trees(mainly trees). The campus has lots of herbal plants. The campus also has all the 27 Star trees. There are 26 IUCN threat category species. There are 20 endemic species. These habitats are shared at different times by a variety of organisms, such as rare plant species, migratory birds, butterflies, snakes, and mammals. Therefore, maintaining the habitat is crucial to maintaining the abundance of biodiversity.

Ponds are significant biodiversity hotspot (82 numbers). More species, including rarer species, are supported by them collectively than by any other freshwater ecosystem. In addition to offering much-needed shelter for birds, mammals, amphibians, reptiles, and flying insects, they also supply drinking water during dry weather and a source of plantand insect-based food for other aquatic organisms, such as phytoplankton and zooplankton. Ponds would have numerous positive benefits, including enhancing the quality of the water, lowering soil and water loss from farms, and giving future generations a chance to discover the wonders of nature. In spite of this, not much study has been done on ponds and their ecological significance. The campus's natural woodlands are situated in the close proximity to these wetlands.

The rich biodiversity at RCMAS aligns with traditional Indian knowledge systems, which emphasize the reverence for medicinal plants and sacred trees as integral to holistic health and ecological balance. The presence of diverse species and water bodies on campus reflects ancient Indian practices of maintaining harmony with nature, recognizing the interconnectedness of ecosystems and the importance of preserving both flora and fauna for future generations.

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

Study tours and industrial visits at RCMAS offer students valuable opportunities to engage with and deepen their understanding of the Indian Knowledge System. These immersive experiences connect students with India's rich heritage of history, art, and culture.

For instance, a visit to the coir factory in Alappuzha, Kerala, allows students to explore the traditional techniques of coir production. They learn about the creation of ecofriendly products like mats, rugs, and ropes, gaining insights into the sustainable practices and socio-economic significance of the coir industry in local communities. Similarly, a tour to the Edakkal Caves in Wayanad provides students with an in-depth look at ancient history and archaeology. By examining prehistoric rock carvings from the Neolithic and early historic periods, they connect with early artistic expressions and cultural practices, enriching their understanding of India's historical and intellectual legacy.

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RCMAS utilized paddy cultivation in 2019 as a practical method to impart traditional Indian knowledge. The cultivation experience included education on natural pest control and organic fertilizers, showcasing traditional ecological knowledge that supports environmental sustainability. By engaging in these practices, students connected with India's agrarian heritage, gaining a deeper understanding of how ancient knowledge informs contemporary agricultural methods. This hands-on approach bridged the gap between historical wisdom and modern practices, enriching students' appreciation of India's agricultural legacy.



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
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
Nagamandala-Workshop on Expressive Movement: The Language of Dance Drama


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Peer to peer teaching on Mohiniyattam

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
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Peer to peer Workshop on Kathak
