The period between 1625 and 1649 is considered as the Caroline Age. It is named after Charles I England king at that time the age is mainly known for the political tensions between King Charles I and the Puritans Charles first exhibited his power to his subjects mainly true massively expensive tableau triumphal arches and masques. The historical significance of the age is marked by the expansion of colonization in the "New World". It was during this age the John Milton began his writing.

During the English Civil War (1642-1651) a group of poets emerged from the circles supporting King Charles I. These poets, known as the "poets" gained favour from Charles due to their artistic abilities. As a result, they became associated with the King and his court, adopting the name Cavalier Poets. Although traditionally referring to mounted soldiers or knights, those who supported Charles were called roistering gallants when described in this context. They were distinct from the Roundheads, who supported Parliament and mostly adhered to Puritan lifestyles and beliefs. They wrote witty and polished lyrics of courtship and gallantry. The group included Richard Lovelace, Sir John Suckling and Thomas Carew. Robert Herrick is often considered as one of the Cavalier Poets. Ben Jonson is also a notable poet who is affiliated with this school of poetry.
