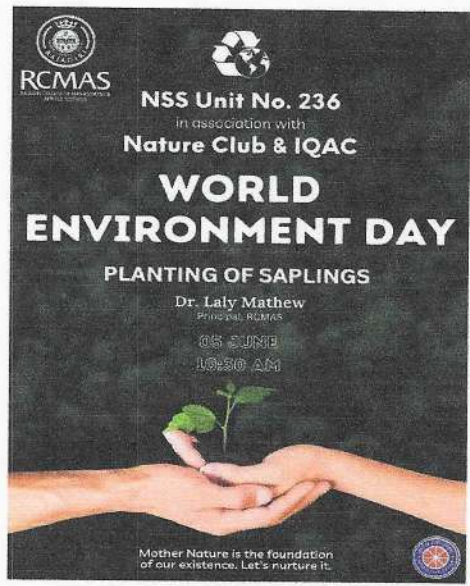

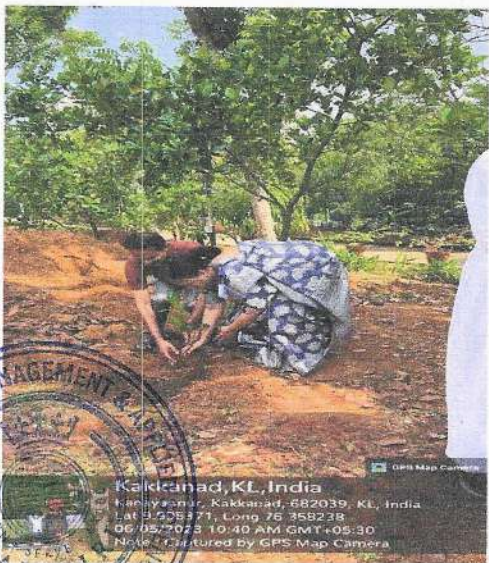




Poster of Planting of Saplings








Poster of Haritham- Seeds to Soil: Organic Farming
