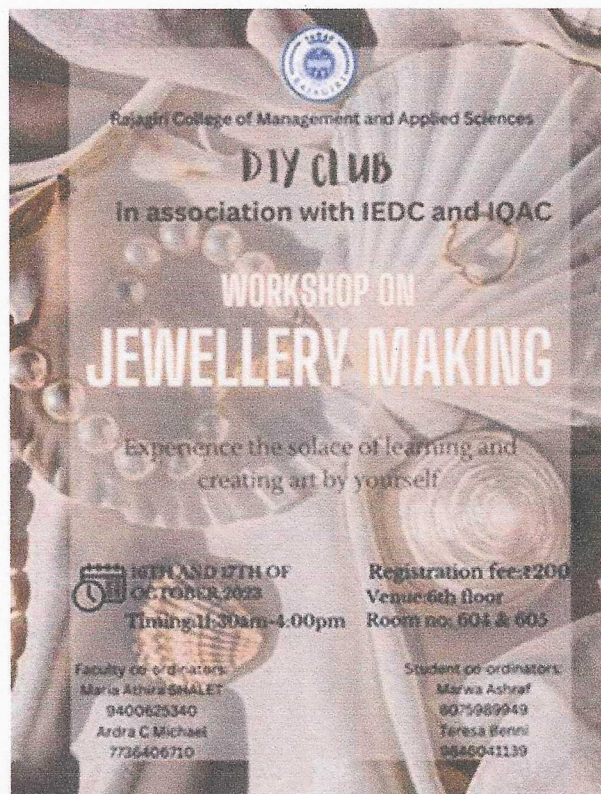
The Jewellery Making Workshop was a resounding success, achieving its goal of introducing participants to the art and techniques of Jewellery Making. It fostered



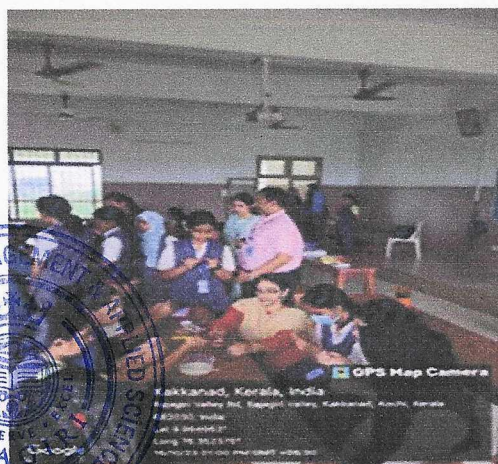
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creativity, skill development, and community among jewellery enthusiasts. We look forward to organizing more workshops in the future to continue nurturing the passion for jewellery making in our community.

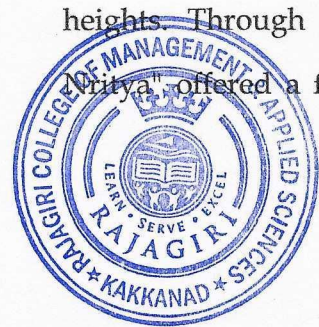

### Report on Alekya Nritya- Fusion of Movement and Style

The Jewellery Making Workshop was a resounding success, achieving its goal of introducing participants to the art and techniques of Jewellery Making. It fostered

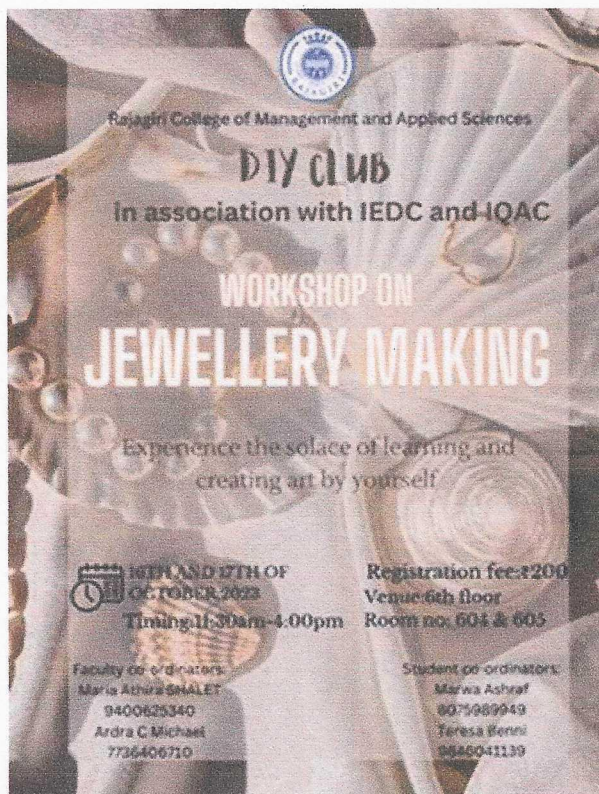


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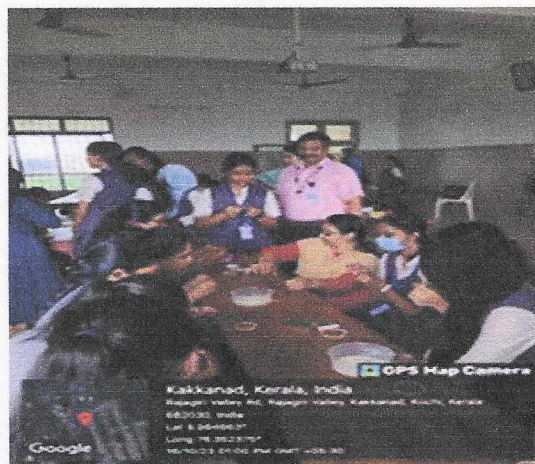
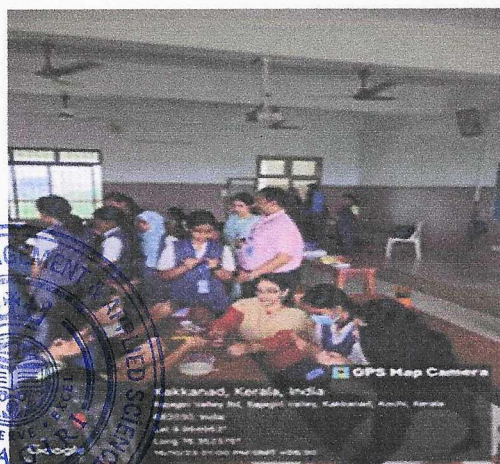
