The Anti-Ragging Committee convened three times during the 2020-21 academic year: on August 20th, 2020, October 22nd, 2020, and January 6th, 2021. The meetings

focused on evaluating progress and planning future initiatives. Most committee members attended these sessions, where they reviewed current anti-ragging methods and discussed additional measures needed post-COVID-19 reopening. Based on the committee's recommendations, the following actions were undertaken.

- The committee proposed to that, once offline classes resume, each year (first, second, and third) should have 15-day sessions. This staggered schedule aims to create smaller student groups, reducing the likelihood of ragging and pandemic.
- A decision was taken to form an anti-ragging squad to strengthen monitoring of first-year students on campus. All first-year batch coordinators will be members of this squad. The squad will ensure that only the respective batch students come to the campus when regular classes start, in accordance with COVID-19 protocols. Additional members can be added to the squad for smooth functioning.
- Anti-ragging posters have been placed on notice boards and information has been updated on the college website. The helpline number and details of the anti-ragging cell members have been shared in students' WhatsApp groups.

Conclusion

The commitment of the Anti-Ragging Cell, along with the engagement of teaching staff, non-teaching staff and student representatives, ensured a ragging-free academic year in 2020-2021.
