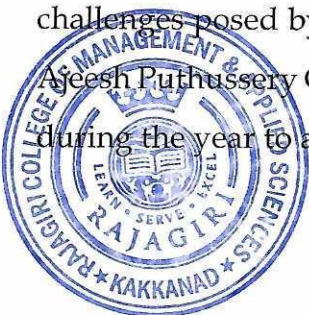

The Anti-Ragging Cell at Rajagiri College of Management and Applied Sciences, Kakkanad, effectively managed its responsibilities during the academic year 2020-2021, ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for all students amidst the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Cell, led by the Principal, Rev. Fr. Ajeesh Puthussery CMI and Convenor Prof. W. T. Paul, held three significant meetings during the year to address and implement anti-ragging measures.



Overview

In the first meeting, held on August 20, 2020, the committee focused on adapting anti-ragging measures to align with COVID-19 protocols. Prof. W. T. Paul was elected as the convener and it was decided that classes would be conducted in staggered 15-day sessions for each batch, aiming to reduce the potential for pandemic and ragging by limiting student interaction. An anti-ragging squad was formed, composed of first-year batch coordinators, to monitor and support new students on campus. The committee also emphasized the importance of submitting anti-ragging affidavits and decided to circulate anti-ragging messages, including the helpline number and committee member details, through various platforms such as notice boards, the college website and WhatsApp groups.

The second meeting on October 22, 2020, reviewed the actions taken since the first meeting. The staggered class schedule had been approved and the anti-ragging squad was fully operational, conducting preliminary monitoring in preparation for the return of students. The submission of anti-ragging affidavits was progressing well, with most students having complied. The dissemination of anti-ragging messages was evaluated, and it was found that the campaign had successfully raised awareness among students.

The final meeting of the academic year took place on January 6, 2021. The committee reviewed the ongoing efforts of the anti-ragging squad, noting that monitoring and reporting systems were functioning effectively. Orientation sessions for first-year students had been conducted, ensuring that new students were informed about the college's anti-ragging policies and the support available to them. Notably, no grievances related to ragging were reported throughout the year, reflecting a positive and ragging-free environment on campus. The Principal, Rev. Fr. Ajeesh Puthussery CMI, praised the dedication of the faculty, staff and coordinators in maintaining a zero-tolerance stance on ragging.
