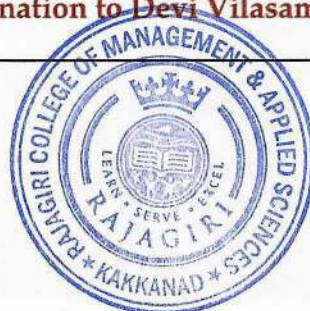

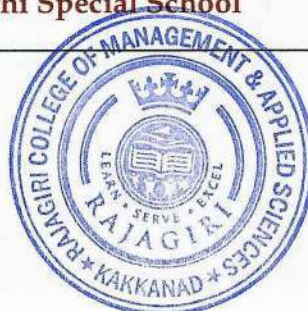
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sense of community.





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skills and engaging students in interactive and fun learning activities.

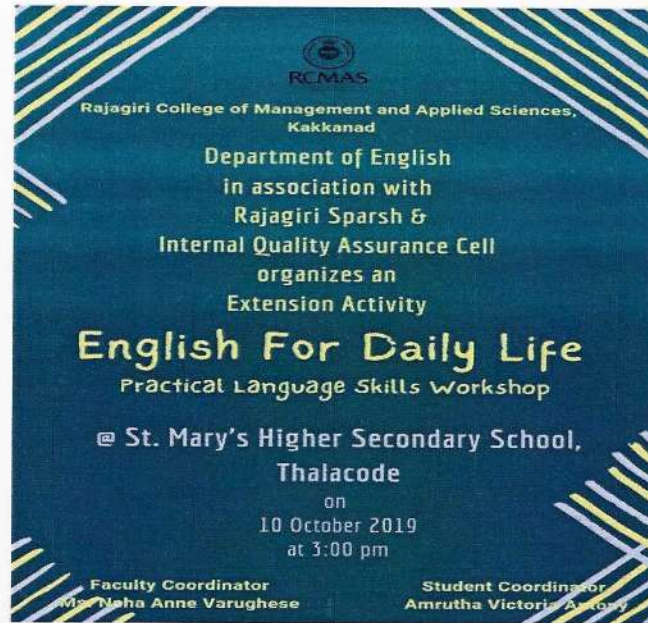

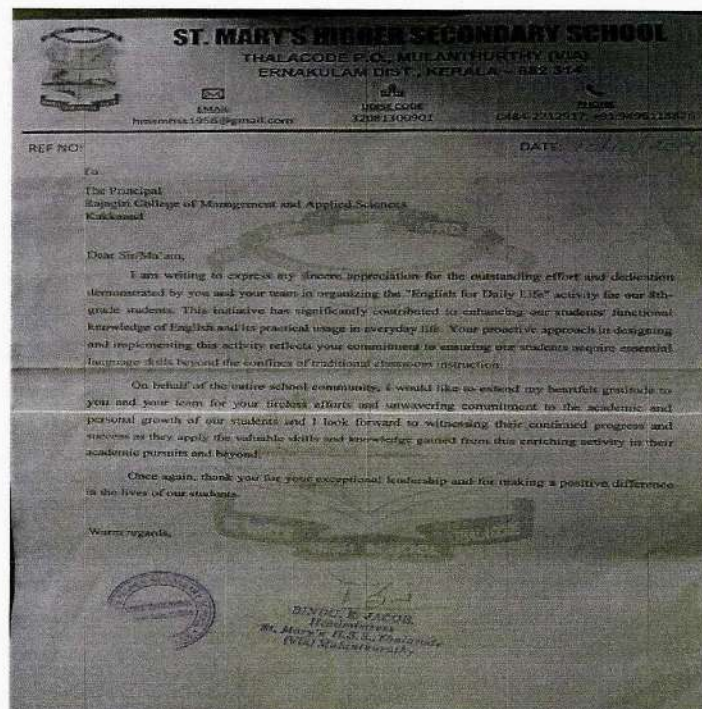
