




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Poster of Postcard Project Phase I: Sandesh Initiative - Reviving Personal Communication

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

The support staff felt delighted after receiving the bags





Feedback from teachers and students alke was overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the enthusiasm and appreciation for the newly acquired books and their potential to

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
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inspire learning and creativity. Many students expressed excitement about delving into their new books, eager to explore new worlds and expand their knowledge.

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




